Chesapeake Energy From only 10 employees a little more than 20 years ago, Chesapeake Energy Corporation has grown to be the second-largest producer of natural gas, a top-15 producer of oil and natural gas liquids, and the most active driller of new wells in the United States. Its business strategy is to focus on exploring for and producing unconventional natural gas, oil and natural gas liquids onshore in the United States.





Recognizing the importance of its leadership position in the industry, Chesapeake endeavors to restore every well site to its original state – or better than its original state – when drilling is finished. Furthermore, Chesapeake implemented its Aqua Renew® Program in 2006 to reuse water produced in its hydraulic fracturing operations, thereby conserving water.

Coca-Cola Bottling Co. Consolidated In the amount of time it will take you to read these pages, Coca-Cola Bottling Co. Consolidated (CCBCC) will have sold 160 cases of soft drinks. That translates to four cases per second, or 14,400 cases per hour. The company moves that volume of product 24 hours a day, seven days a week.





CCBCC is the largest independent Coca-Cola bottler in the United States. The company makes, sells and distributes Coca-Cola products, along with other unique beverages, to 95,000 customers within a consumer base of approximately 20 million people.

CCBCC has approximately 7,000 employees, five production centers and 46 distribution centers. The company operates in 11 states, primarily in the southeastern United States.
