

CHARLESTON, W.Va. -- Two former top executives at the West Virginia Offices of the Insurance Commissioner have joined the law firm Spilman Thomas & Battle.

Jane Cline has joined the firm as director of public policy and Mary Jane Pickens has joined the firm as counsel.

Cline retired from state government in June after a 30-year career. She was state insurance commissioner from 2001 to June 30 and was commissioner of the Division of Motor Vehicles from 1989 to 1997.

At Spilman Thomas & Battle, Cline will be a key leader of the Public Policy, Advocacy and Reform Group and will be actively involved in government relations, the firm said.
